CROOK'S CORNER BOOK PRIZE ANNOUNCES LONGLIST

Chapel Hill, NC—The Crook's Corner Book Prize Foundation announces its annual Longlist for best debut novel set in the American South. Now in its seventh year, the \$5000 prize will be presented in January 2020.

The mission of the Crook's Corner Book Prize is to encourage emerging fiction writers, who typically face some of the toughest obstacles in today's publishing environment. "Nothing is more thrilling than to discover a bright new talent," says Anna Hayes, president of the Foundation, "and this year's Longlist is bursting with new talent from established publishers and small, independent publishers alike."

The award is co-sponsored by the James Beard America's Classic restaurant in Chapel Hill, NC, Crook's Corner, and is modeled on the prestigious literary prizes given by famous Parisian cafés such as the Café de Flore and the Deux Magots. Although eligible books must be set in the South, authors may live anywhere, and all genres of fiction except for Young Adult are eligible.

The winner of the 2019 Award was Margaret Wilkerson Sexton's <u>A Kind of Freedom</u> (Counterpoint Press). This year's judge is North Carolina National Book Award-winning novelist Charles Frazier. The Shortlist will be announced in September.
